What's in a name? Does this phrase ring a bell?

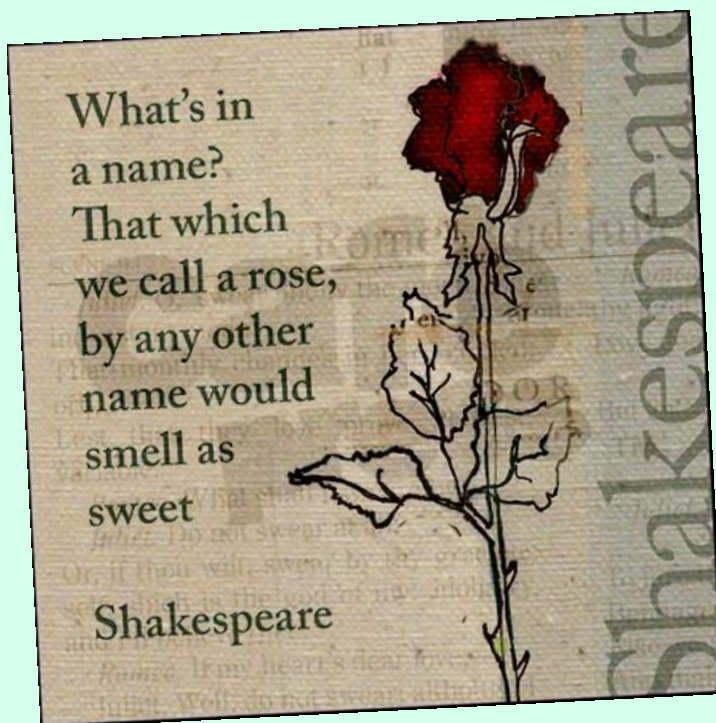
Hmm, do you remember the balcony scene in Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet ?

***“What's in a name? That which we call a rose
By any other name would smell as sweet.”***

Juliet is not allowed to associate with Romeo because he is a Montague. If he had any other name it would be fine. She's complaining that his name is meaningless. If the rose had any other name it would still be the same. So with Romeo; he would still be the same beautiful young man even if he had a different name.

“What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet”... Juliet, a Capulet, knows that the blood feud prevents her from loving a Montague. It's only your name that's the enemy. You are what you are, even though you may be a Montague. Oh I wish you had a different name. What is so special about a name? A rose, even if it were called

something else, would smell just as sweet. So Romeo would still have all the perfection that he has, even if he were not called Romeo. Romeo, take off your name and in exchange for that whole name, which is not really a part of what you are, you can have all of me.

What's in a name? There are other, more casual times this is used as well like when people say that names don't really matter. Take for example designer brands – Prada, Gucci, Vuitton, Chanel.. fancy bags, shoes, clothing. **What's in a name anyway?** You can buy an imitation for much cheaper and still have a dress or a purse or whatever.

MARLENE

BELOVED & EXALTED

(MAHR-leen) 1. Origin: a female personal name, a German coinage created through the combination of *Maria* and *Magdalene*, in honor of Mary, Mother of Jesus and Mary Magdalene, a disciple of Christ, respectively; from *Maria*, Old Hebrew *Miryám* (by way of Greek *Μαρία*), of debated origin, though strongest evidence points to an Ancient Egyptian root *mry* "beloved;" and *Magdalene* from Aramaic *Maghdela* "high tower, exalted," from *Magdala*, a small, ancient village on the Sea of Galilee; 2. Historic: *Maria Magdalene* was a commonly found pairing in Europe during the Middle Ages, a way for Christians to celebrate both Marys from the New Testament (the French created *Madeleine* while the Germans contracted it to *Marlene*); 3. Usage: *Marlene* came into general use among English speakers in the 1930s owing to the superstardom of German actress and singer *Marlene Dietrich* (1901-1992), a sultry, husky-voiced, pantsuit-wearing beauty whose unapologetic *femme fatale* film characters helped redefine notions of modern femininity.
